Mazovia constitutes 28.55% of the national surface of orchards, which means that almost every third fruit tree in Poland grows in the region. There are more than 200 establishments here from the fruit and vegetable industry.

MAZOVIA TODAY

Mazovia (area 35 597 km²), with the capital of the country, Warsaw, is the wealthiest region of Poland, a business centre with the largest Stock Exchange (Warsaw Stock Exchange), in Central Europe. The region is of an industrial - agricultural nature, a dynamically developing economy and the highest production potential in the country. Significant industrial centres: Warsaw, Płock, Radom, Siedlce, Ostrołęka and Ciechanów.

Mazovia is the basin of horticulture and pomiculture (south-western and central part of the voivodeship). More than half of the national harvest of apples, 24% of strawberries and 18% of vegetables come from the Mazovian voivodeship. Mazovia comes first in Europe in champignon cultivation.

Mazovia has unusual natural qualities, protected, among others, by the European network Natura 2000. The Kampinos National Park (west of Warsaw) is located here, the only reserve in Europe contiguous with great urban agglomerations. On the sandy shores of the Vistula and in the riparian forests surrounding it nests almost 2/3 of Europe's bird species.

Mazovia is a significant place for Polish history and culture. In addition to the numerous historical sites of the capital, among others, the Old Town (inscribed onto the UNESCO list in 1980), the Royal Castle and the Palace in Wilanów, it is worth visiting Płock (Prince's Castle from the 14th century), Siedlee (Ogiński Palace from the first half of the 18th century), Żelazowa Wola (manor house - the birthplace of F. Chopin), and Czerwińsk by the Vistula, the place of King Wladyslaw Jagiello's journey over the Bridge of Boats to Grunwald (Salesian monastery with a Romanesque church from the years 1129-56).
